There was a traveling "carnival" that came to Estherwood one summer and set up behind our little wooden church. I put the word carnival in quotation marks because all it consisted of was a man with one ride that was these metal flying swings that would go round and round like a carousel. The ride was so poorly constructed that the metal on the swings would lightly shock you as everything would set in motion. The man also sold cotton candy, candied apples and he had a monkey.

In our little town, we thought Walt Disney himself had descended in our midst to bring wonder and joy to our drab lives. We loved it. We talked about it for days. It was the most exciting thing to hit our town in ages. I know that sounds so sad, but it was a much simpler time in country life. It seemed much easier to spark wonder in a child. That same wonder that came from riding a bike for the first time or opening that Christmas gift you really wanted because you knew there wasn't going to be many gifts throughout the rest of the year. That same wonder that came with the first blackberries or figs or crawfish each year.

The wonder of a child exploring life and treasuring things that would be so fleeting. Maybe that's why Jesus wants us to live like children. Maybe He wants us to experience wonder at the simplest and most beautiful of things and not just surrender our every waking moment to technology. Maybe He wants us to look at our present and be filled with wonder.

I always thought St. Francis of Assisi had that sense of wonder about him. He looked at creatures about him and saw them connected to himself. They were his brothers and sisters. Brother Sun and Sister Moon. Wonder.

God breathed His life into the world and wants us to see and know His glory that fills us with wonder. He wants us to look at ourselves and see that we are fearfully and wonderfully made.
