Pastoral Reflection...

"The fields are high, and summer's days are few; green fields have turned to gold. The time is here for the harvesting, for gathering home into barns. The harvest is plenty, laborers are few, come with me into the fields. Your arms may grow weary; your shoes will wear thin. Come with me into the fields." This beautiful song by Dan Schutte speaks of mission based on the scriptural passage about the laborers for the harvest.

The mission that Jesus calls us to is not always easy. There are times when doing the right thing and trying to live out the gospel of Jesus Christ is not easy at all. The invitation to be a laborer in the harvest, to join Jesus in His mission of building the kingdom, to love unconditionally and forgive with abandon calls for a strong and fierce faith.

It is so much easier to criticize and judge and demonize others. Their foibles anger and frighten us. They are not deserving of our attentions, not worthy of our love.

Our arms will go weary from carrying the concerns and needs of others. We will confront a tiresomeness that seems overwhelming. We will continue to judge those we serve and condemn those who need us. Our weary arms will want us to turn away, abandon the mission and discipleship.

Our hearts, like our shoes, will wear thin from being stretched and overworked. The demands of the gospel to choose love over hate and indifference will strain even the strongest of hearts. The demands of love will always test us and require of us feats that we had thought unimaginable. To make the decision to love is a formidable task, but a necessary part of our pilgrimage of faith. To love God is to love ourselves and our neighbors. The harvest is indeed plenty. Let us be counted among the few laborers and our efforts be found worthy. May His mercy make us merciful.
