From Msgr. Harrington...

The First Epistle of John has a number of beautiful and inspiring passages, but the following is sometimes used for funerals and speaks to the vision that God has for all of us. Chapter 3:1-3.

"See what love the Father has bestowed on us in letting us be called the children of God! Yet that is what we are. The reason the world does not recognize us is that it never recognized the Son.

Dearly beloved, we are God's children now; what we shall later be has not yet come to light. We know that when it comes to light we shall be like Him, for we shall see Him as He is. Everyone who has this hope based on Him keeps himself pure, as he is pure."

We are God's children now! That is what grace reminds us of throughout our lives. The whispers of God speak deeply to our hearts to let us know how He sees us. He sees us as His children - all of us - every one of us. We each have the imprint of God on our soul. The brokenness of the world will try to make us question that. The weariness of the world will tell us we are not wonderful in God's eyes; it makes us insecure, doubting, resentful, sad, or angry. God's love demands that we see ourselves as His children now.

God's love also demands that we see others as His children. If we cannot see ourselves as His child, how can we ever hope to see our neighbor as His child as well? How can we help but condemn them or hate them or not trust them or be afraid of them if we cannot see that they share our identity as His children? If we can so easily cast others aside for any reason whatsoever, what makes us any better than the Pharisees or the hypocrites that Jesus continuously challenged? We are ALL God's children now.

We know that we shall see Him as He is. He will be radiant and bear the face of His children. He will be light
