From Msgr. Harrington ...

This past week Associated Press ran an article in publications throughout the world about a Christmas Eve concert that was held in the Norte Dame Cathedral in Paris, France. There was no audience or congregation because the Cathedral is still a construction site after the terrible fire of last year.

Twenty singers performed along with a cellist, professional soprano, and organist performed beneath the cathedral's stained-glass windows amid the darkened church. They all wore hard hats and protective suits. The diocese called it a "highly symbolic concert...marked with emotion and hope", and a celebration of a "musical heritage that dates to the Middle Ages."

Gautier Capucon, the cellist, remarked, "It was very moving. It was the first time we had all been back at Notre Dame cathedral since the fire, so it was a moment full of emotion."

Many remember the trauma of seeing this magnificent, sacred edifice ablaze in the Paris night. How terrible to witness the devastating destruction of such a holy landmark in Christendom, a beautiful masterpiece of stone and mortar, legendary windows, a vessel of grace and inspiration.

What a gift it must have been for those musicians to record the concert days before Christmas Eve in a sacred space that had been so damaged and broken. It seems to elicit a sense of hope, a hint of promise that music could heal the brokenness of a house of God. That it will be good one day, it will be alive again with prayer and worship, the gathering place for God's people.

Epiphany is about hope. It is about three people who followed a star to a sacred place of brokenness, a darkened manger, an animal stall. They brought gifts but left with so much more. They left with hope and promise. They left knowing that they had set their sight on a newborn king that would change their lives, change the world. They gazed upon the majesty of God in innocence and vulnerability and did not look away. We gaze upon the hope of this same Christ and know that we can follow that same star to hope.

In the darkness of a broken cathedral, we play our music and sing the songs of hope. We chant the Lord's praises because we know He is with us always.
