From Msgr. Harrington ...

As I'm writing this, I can hear the students from Opelousas Catholic walking over to church to celebrate mass. I can hear the ringing of their laughter and the echoes of their energy and reflect on their resilience and enthusiasm. They've had to make so many adjustments to their pursuit of education because of the pandemic. They've had to adapt to new forms of instruction and directives that have called them to make sacrifices and changes to their daily life. It has been an added burden to our young people that already lived under great pressure and strain.

They have to witness the smallness of the human heart by adults in a turbulent time in our history. What kind of examples have been given to the vulnerable souls entrusted to our care? What have they really learned from the violence and bitterness that spews forth from every side of every issue? What have we passed on to them?

And yet, if anything, our young brothers and sisters have shown remarkable spirit. We can learn so much from their strength and faith. I'm sure they have done their share of complaining and moaning, but they still laugh, they still thrive in the harshest of environments.

They apply themselves to new ways of learning. They adapt to the demands made of them. They celebrate the Eucharist as the children of a merciful Father. Their spirit is strong, and their faith is unshakeable. They teach us so much about what is important. Our time together is important. The energies we share with each other are important. Our capacity to love in the midst of our own brokenness is important. An authentic respect for all life is important. Our grasping the moment which we will never have again is important.

I am grateful for the young. They lead us to the mysteries of the kingdom. They skin a knee, but they get right up and continue to run. They stumble over one another to get a bulletin ('a church paper') that is a simple piece of paper that has drawings and puzzles and passes on stories of Jesus. They are grateful and thankful for much of what they receive.

They bless us by their faith and indomitable spirit. As we try to thrive in the midst of that same hostile environment, we turn to them to teach us how to refocus our heart and souls on the Gospel of Jesus and what it means to sit upon His knee and receive His blessings.
