From Msgr. Harrington ...

Psalm 142 is a prayer of a prisoner in dire straits, but it also speaks to us when we find ourselves imprisoned. When we feel as though we are being held captive against our own wishes by circumstances beyond our control, it is an excellent prayer to us in our hour of need. The prayer teaches us to rely on the Lord, to trust in His presence in our lives.

How easy is it for us to not trust in Him? How easy is it for us to blame Him for any ills we may be experiencing? How easy is it for us to believe that He is punishing us for something we have done or didn't do or for who we are? That is not the Father that Jesus came to reveal, some vengeful merciless God ready to pounce on us when we are steeped in sin. If we are immersed in sin or despair it is not God who put us there. However, it is God who frees us with His mercy.

With a loud voice I cry out to the Lord; with a loud voice I beseech the Lord. My complaint I pour out before Him; before Him I lay bare my distress. When my spirit is faint within me, You know my path.

In the way along which I walk they have hid a trap for me. I look to the right to see, but there is no one who pays me heed. I have lost all means of escape; there is no one who cares about my life.

I cry out to you O Lord; I say, "You are my refuge, my portion in the land of the living." Attend to my cry, for I am brought low indeed. Rescue me from my persecutors, for they are too strong for me. Lead me forth from prison, that I may give thanks to your name. The just shall gather around me when you have been good to me.
