From Msgr. Harrington...

We live in the midst of a great deal of noise. The sounds of trains and traffic, sirens and alarms, angry conversations and shouted insults, revved engines and window-shaking music – and that's just here around the church. That doesn't account for all the sounds in our inner selves, all the noise that rumbles within us.

There is noise pollution that we face both outside and inside of ourselves. Before we surrender to complaining about all the noises around us, let us look within. Those self-destructive musings within sometimes go way beyond a healthy examination of conscience. We are ever poised to berate ourselves, castigate ourselves, belittle ourselves to the point of violently chipping away at our own worth and dignity as a child of God.

Our vision of ourselves is usually so distorted that it renders us unrecognizable before our own eyes. We focus on all the bad of who we think we are to such a degree that is impossible to see any of the good. We cannot hear the Spirit of God within the deepest recesses of our own hearts. All we hear is the violent noise of our own self-condemnation. We cannot recognize Him because we cannot recognize ourselves.

Original sin is that sin that stained creation from the first sin. Original sin is the inability to recognize the mercy of God. It is the need to hide from a God that we think will ridicule and punish our nakedness. We have to hide from Him in the cool of the evening when Adam and Eve regularly encountered Him. We hear His angry voice not because He is angry with us but because we fill His thoughts with our angry words toward ourselves. But His thoughts are not our thoughts. His ways are not our ways.

Jesus brings us peace. His peace is His gift to us. His silence is His response to our unsettled hearts. He brings quiet into the noise that clamors within. He brings peace to the wars that rage within us.

Let us turn from the noise and allow God's grace to 'still' our hearts.
