FATHER LAFLEUR "CAUSE"

The US bishops voted last week that they consider it opportune to advance two causes of canonization, for Father Joseph Verbis Lafleur, a World War II military chaplain, and for Marinus (Leonard) LaRue, a merchant mariner who became a Benedictine monk.

Both causes were regarded as opportune by 99 percent of voting bishops in June 17 votes at the USCCB spring general assembly.

"It was something I would have never thought would have happened in my lifetime," said Carrol Lafleur, the wife of Father Lafleur's nephew, Richard. "I had always hoped that my children would have gotten to see it. But for Richard and I to actually see it, see it in progress, and to have people want to know about Fr.
