Pastoral Reflection #11

We live in a fast-paced, fast-food world. We want everything yesterday, and we want it to be in perfect condition. If we ordered a burger with no ketchup, we expect it to have no ketchup. As consumers, we want to consume when and how we want. We expect the seller to cater to our demands and be grateful for our business. Somewhere and somehow, along the line we have become Entitled. We have allowed our Entitlement to infiltrate our spirituality and our theology.

God had better deliver. If He does not deliver to our satisfaction, we're taking our business elsewhere. The deal is clear: we'll follow His rules, say our prayers, admit our faults, toe the line, now He needs to live up to His side of the bargain. Nothing short of successfully attending to our demands will suffice. Otherwise, why waste our precious time believing in Him? If He's not going to live up to His end of the bargain, why should we?

We must often be terribly disappointed. This covenant we made with God where we agreed to be His people and He would be our God, seemed to be a pretty sweet deal. There was no 'fine print' that we had to fear, so we agreed to sign.

But God's grace is not an item on a celestial menu that we can order with a side salad. It is not a shiny new vehicle that we purchase with an extended warranty that goes beyond thirty thousand miles. God's love for us isn't wrapped up in some 'lemon law' that we can return and get our hard-earned money back if we are not fully satisfied.

God's grace is a living relationship between God and His beloved children. It is an ongoing, active bond colored with the vibrancy of life. It is not some stagnant product to be returned. We share in the life of God, and everything that means. We go to the hills together and the valleys together. We move in God's time, not some manufactured 9-5 period with a half hour lunch and full benefits.

There is a wildness in God's grace not defined by space and time. That is why we move beyond idolatry. The beautiful sacramentals we have, statues or pendants or books are sacred items to remind us of the omnipresence of God, not to confine His restless Spirit. Our relationship with this fiercely loving God is more than a contract, it is a covenant. It is more than a business agreement or a good deal. It is alive with the fire of grace. It is a burning bush that is not consumed; a star that leads to hope and peace; an empty tomb that radiates new life; an upper room that is emptied out to bring the Spirit of God to the world. We carry that same Spirit in relationship. We slow down to recognize the true power we have in Him. We are countercultural in a culture that is entitled. We seek to serve rather than be served. We hope to be last so that we might be first.

Cursillo is an apostolic movement within the Catholic Church that began in Spain in 1944. In 1961, the first English-speaking retreat was held in Texas, and soon spread across the country. The retreat is a three-day "course" in Christianity. For over 50 years, this retreat has continued in Prairie Rhonde. Thousands of lay faithful have made the retreat and have come to encounter Christ. The primary goal of the Cursillo movement is to help adult Christians to allow Christ to transform every aspect of our modern life.
