Pastoral Reflection 13

She came up behind Him and touched the fringe of His garment, and immediately she was healed. This woman's story told in the Gospel of Luke (8:43-48) is just a few verses long but powerful in its message. She could find no one who could heal her. For over twelve years she suffered with this hemorrhaging. She had begun to lose all hope of being rid of this malady. This was her last chance. In her desperation she felt that a simple touch of His garment would save her. And she was right.

Jesus felt the power leave Him. With all the people crowding around Him, how could He know such a thing? Everybody was pushing and shoving, wanting an encounter with Him. How did He know this one touch and the healing power it drained from Him?

She thought she could be lost in her anonymity. She thought she was safe to exit the crowd, newly healed, newly transformed. But Jesus wanted to know who touched Him and drew the power from Him. She comes trembling before Him. She kneels before Him and declares herself.

"Daughter, your faith has made you well; go in peace." And that's where all reference to this woman ends. Who was she? Where did she go after the healing? Did she become a follower? Did she bring others to the Lord? Did she help other experience the healing power of the Master? Where did her faith lead her after this monumental event in her life?

In five short verses of Sacred Scripture, we see the story of a woman whose faith has saved her. We see her fight the crowds to simply touch the fringe of the Master's garment to be finally and wholly healed of an illness that drained her life. In her desperation, she was not interested in protocol or proper etiquette. A simple touch, a complicated touch. When confronted, she declares herself, humbly kneeling before the Lord. Her faith was strong; her faith saved her.

Our stories are not brief to us, not wedged between some other larger story of Sacred Scripture. Our stories sometimes cry out for the same healing; our lives are draining; our desperation drives us. We seek to touch the fringe of His garment. He feels the power leave Him, but He does not turn away. He gives His love freely and wholly. We kneel before Him with humbled and grateful hearts. Our faith has made us well.

Through this holy anointing, may the Lord in His love and mercy,
help you with the grace of the Holy Spirit. May the Lord, who
frees you from sin, save you and raise you up.
