From the Desk of Msgr. Harrington...

The history of the American version of Mother's Day is quite interesting. According to Wikipedia, the first modern celebration was in 1908, when Anna Jarvis held a memorial for her mother at St. Andrew's Methodist Church in Grafton, West Virginia. She had been crusading to have a national holiday in the United States since 1905, the year of her mother's death. Her mother, Anna Reeves Jarvis, had been a peace activist who cared for wounded soldiers from both the North and the South during the Civil War. She also created Mother's Day Work Clubs to address public health issues.

Anna Jarvis wanted to honor her mother by not only continuing her work, but also setting aside a day to honor all mothers. Her belief was that a mother is "the person who has done the most for you than anyone in the world".

It is interesting to note that Anna protested for the rest of her life the commercialization of Mother's Day. She ended up organizing boycotts of Mother's Day and threatened lawsuits. She even protested a candy-makers' convention in Philadelphia in 1923 and was arrested for disturbing the peace in 1925 at a meeting of American War Mothers who were selling carnations for Mother's Day to raise money.

Anna's strong opinions focused on the fact that persons should honor their own mothers on this day, recognizing the individual mother rather than some vague, general commemoration of all mothers of the world. That is why she insisted in Mother's Day rather than Mothers' Day, a singular possessive not a plural possessive.

This Sunday is the Fourth Sunday of Easter, with readings focusing on Jesus as the Good Shepherd. The gospel speaks of the unique bond between Jesus and His flock. His voiced is recognized by His followers and brings hope, consolation, direction, nourishment. The shepherd is the caretaker of the flock.

A parent is the caretaker of the child. And so it is that on this Mother's Day we recognize our individual mothers and the lives they have shared with those entrusted to their care, to those they have enriched with hope, consolation, direction, nourishment, love.

On behalf of the staff here at St. Landry Church, I would like to wish a Happy Mother's Day to the mothers of our community, especially those who have not had their praises sung, who have not been duly recognized as the heroines of their stories and their children's' lives, or have nurtured others when they had no children of their own. We pray for and honor all those who embraced a child, who held up a sacred creation of God to steal a kiss from that same God, who dedicated their lives to their vocation of being a vessel of love and God's grace.
