Mission Statement:

From the desk of Msgr. Harrington...

So much can happen to a person between the ages of twelve and thirty. That eighteen-year span begins with pre-adolescence and ends with adulthood. For many of us that time frame is when we come to know ourselves and try to understand who we are meant to be.

On a relationship scale we go from childhood bonds to marriage commitments and sacred friendships that will nurture our adult years. Those years are when most people begin families and establish homes.

On a career scale we go from Junior High to discovering who we think we want to be and what vocation best suits us or what profession allows us to be who we think we should be. We go from classroom education to a new dimension of life-experience education. In the course of those eighteen years, we might try on different professions to see how they fit.

We transition from childhood to adulthood, not only physically, but emotionally and spiritually. We no longer rely solely on the primary nurturers of our youth but learn an interdependence with others in our journey. Our faith journey becomes our own journey and not just what we learned from our parents.

Stop and reflect on how much change took place or is taking place in your life between the ages of twelve and thirty. Reflect on how much you have grown between those years and all that you experienced during those years in your journey. Reflect on the people you encountered and how their lives impacted yours, challenged you or affirmed you.

There is a noticeable silence in Sacred Scripture when it comes to revealing the story of Jesus and what His life was like between the ages of twelve and thirty. St. Luke's gospel tells the story of Jesus being accidentally left behind in Jerusalem when He was twelve. The gospel speaks of the encounter Mary and Joseph have with their new-found son. Then it tells of how He returned to Nazareth and grew in "wisdom and age and grace before God and men".

The gospel then addresses John the Baptist and his ministry. It doesn't get back to Jesus until His own baptism and the beginning of His public ministry. It is here where St. Luke says that Jesus began His work when He was about thirty years of age. Luke is the only gospel that gives even that much information. Matthew skips from the Holy Family leaving Egypt to Jesus' baptism. Mark begins with John the Baptist and Jesus' baptism. John's gospel begins with his beautiful prologue about the "Word made flesh" then goes to John the Baptist and Jesus' baptism.

What do you think Jesus did for those eighteen years? Did He work with Joseph, did He work elsewhere? Was He educated in the synagogue? Did some Rabbi take Him under his wing and instruct Him in the ways of the Torah? Did He have childhood friends that became a part of His adult life? Did He and His parents gather with extended family to celebrate Passover or the Jewish feasts? Was some great uncle a good storyteller and taught how to tell a parable? Did the Blessed Mother teach Him how to love beyond reason? Did St. Joseph teach Him how to be a carpenter and how to dedicate a life to someone else's dreams? Did they all go fishing together?

Do you think they prayed and sang together into the late hours of the night? And with each dawn, greeted the day in wonder and delight? Did they whisper each other's names before the Father? Can you see them praying for each other and the Father's children throughout time? What an interesting eighteen years that must have been. Then at the age of thirty He began His public ministry.
