From the desk of Msgr. Harrington...

"What sort of man is this that even the winds and the sea obey him?" Matthew 8:27. The disciples find themselves on a boat with Jesus in the midst of a violent storm. While they are panicked and fearful He is sound asleep. Who sleeps soundly on a rickety fishing boat in the midst of a terrible storm where the boat is swamped by waves? Who would not be afraid?

The disciples are justified in their fear and terror. They were all too familiar with storms and the aftermath of those storms. People could lose their lives. Families could lose their loved ones to the violence of the sea. Anytime a storm brewed up it could cause terrible damage and leave sadness and brokenness in its wake.

We have been through hurricanes. We know the power of the storm and what it is capable of – the destruction it can bring. To be in the middle of a raging storm on a boat would be a terrifying experience. The disciples were right to be afraid.

Yet when they woke Jesus, He doesn't sound very happy with them. He's still not concerned about the storm. He chastises them for lacking courage and faith. We may have answered back. "Are you kidding me? You're going to chastise us about courage in the middle of a terrible storm? Do you really think we have little faith when everything points to disaster? Our very lives are in jeopardy and you want us to be courageous and filled with faith?"

Matthew says He stood up and took the winds and sea to task. Complete calm ensued. Nobody on that boat must have been from around here. Complete calm would have been a long way off. We would have been talking about that storm for days and weeks and how awful it was to be in the middle of it. We would have blamed Jesus for leading us into that terror and barely acknowledged that He calmed the winds and the sea. We would have cursed the darkness and missed the light.

There will always be storms in our lives. That is part of what it means to be a created entity, to be human. Storms come and go, and our response is important. Do we simply panic or face the storm with the confidence in the presence of Jesus on our boat?

We need to be reminded that Jesus is always with us in our boat. He may appear to be sleeping soundly, but He's very much awake and aware of our circumstances. The courage given to us may not make the storm go away of even weaken. The courageous faith this is grace-given to us comes from the presence of the Divine Master. It tells us that we are not alone in the storm. He is with us. He will always be with us.

When the boat starts to toss around and we can hardly hear ourselves think because the wind is so fierce and loud, that is when we wake ourselves up to see that He is with us. When the water laps up on the side of the vessel and we feel it is only a matter of seconds before we capsize and go under, He is there with us. He has stretched His arms wide upon the cross to embrace the world, to embrace each and every one of us, even in the storms – especially in the storms. He is the master of the winds and the rains. They are subject to His will. He may not remove them, but He will help us face them. He will help us to find the courage-faith to stand in the midst of the storms and not allow their forces to define us. His grace emboldens us to trust in His presence. There is no separating us from the love of God in Christ Jesus. Not even the raging storm.


