From the desk of Msgr. Harrington...

"One of Jesus' disciples, Andrew, Simon Peter's brother, remarked to him, 'There is a lad here who has five barley loaves and a couple of dried fish, but what good is that for so many?" John 6:8-9 The needs of others can be overwhelming. How are we supposed to take care of each other? We start out with so little but so much is demanded of us. Then there comes a time where we feel we have done our part, we have so little left, maybe it's someone else's turn. Who is going to care of us? Why do we have to take care of everybody else?

Why does God ask this of us? Why does Jesus challenge us to tend to others when our own cupboards are so bare? We have so little to offer, surely He wants someone else to do this. Jesus knows all of us, surely He can see that there are others who would do a much better job. Surely He can see that there are others who have much more to offer. Why does He want our five barley loaves and two dried fish? How is it Andrew's business to ask us to share what little we have?

In the gospel story of the multiplication of loaves, did the 'lad' freely give his loaves and fish? It's funny that someone didn't tell Andrew to go mind his own business or at least go find food somewhere else. Phillip was concerned the Lord wanted them to pay for everything; it would have cost almost a year's wages just for one mouthful of food for each person. Who would pay for that? Who could pay for that? Why would someone pay for that? Who would ask such a thing?

How could they be expected to pay for the needs of others out of their own poverty? How can we pay out of our own poverty? That sure seems like a lot to ask. And then there's the worry that He is not asking, but maybe He's *commanding*. This could get uncomfortable. Is this something we want to do?

The Letter to the Hebrews says that Jesus emptied Himself. He did not see equality with God something to be grasped at but took the form of a slave. Once again, is this something we really want to do? Do we want to surrender ourselves before Jesus, allow Him to empty our very selves, allow Him to take our few loaves of bread and a couple of dried fish – bless the little and the empty, break it all and then hand it out to everyone else, even the undeserving?

What is God asking us to do? What does He want of us? The will of the Father is quite clearly made known by Jesus the Christ. We are to love God with our whole being and our neighbors as we love ourselves. Those two commandments are the foundation of this invitation of surrender. If we hold on to the loaves and the fishes, if we clutch them ever closer to our insecure hearts, if we hide them in the folds of our selfishness, our greed, our lack of trust in God, we lose. We lose our battle with evil. We lose our battle with our baser selves. We lose each other to bitterness and resentment.

The story of the multiplication was a way of telling the story of the Eucharist. Jesus held back nothing for the sake of His people – our sakes. He gave His loaves, His fish, His mother, His body and blood, His very self. He blessed all of it by thanking the Father. He surrendered it all to be broken. He handed out to feed all creation.

He asks the same of us but assures us of His presence with us in the surrendering. He assures us that He went through it all so that He can go through it with us. His Incarnation is that vehicle of redemption that leads us to all grace. The journey leads to surrender and eventually to the Father. Our mission is never complete because God's love for His people never ends.
