From the desk of Msgr. Harrington...

Last week's reflection focused mostly on our tendency to be judgmental and served as a reminder of the scriptural challenge that we will be judged by how we judge; how we measure will be how we are measured. Woven in the reflection was also the call to forgiveness and mercy toward one another.

Deep in our hearts we erroneously believe that if we forgive someone we are saying that what they said or did to us was not so bad. We know that if we forgive we run the risk of being seen as weak. We know that we make ourselves vulnerable once again. Somehow the hurt is unsurmountable, too big to be cast aside as if nothing has happened. How do we know it will not happen again? How do we know we will not be betrayed again?

How can we forgive when the hurt keeps coming back into our minds? We watch it repeatedly take our breath away – like some movie screen in our head that keeps playing the scene ad nauseam. How could we have been so gullible to fall for this again? How could we allow ourselves to be so used, so harmfully treated? Are we so naïve that we're like duck decoys all lined up to be targets of someone else's cruelty or inconsiderateness? If we forgive will we not be treated the same way? If we forgive are we letting the culprit off free and not making them face the consequences of their disturbing actions?

Many times, we convince ourselves that we are incapable of forgiveness. Why bother trying? We won't be able to do it anyway.

Forgiveness is risky. Forgiveness is courageous. It means making our other cheek vulnerable to the second slap. It means looking down from the cross and asking the Father's mercy for the jeerers and the despisers and the violent. It means putting the other first and the self last. True forgiveness comes at a cost. To be forgiving means to look into the face of the shadow of death and see the brightness of resurrection. It is hard to see that brightness when we wear thick lenses of hurt and brokenness, when our perception is impaired by fear.

To complicate matters, we find that it is necessary from time to time to step back from the place where our hurt occurred, to step away from the person who is the threat to our well-being. This also is not an easy decision. It seems contrary to the call for forgiveness. But the harsh reality of life can challenge us to defend our 'personhood' at times because we need to protect our sacred nature. We cannot allow our very selves to suffer at the hands of others who fundamentally do not respect our identity as a sacred child of God. In those times, forgiveness is called for at a later moment, not while the inner core of a person is so threatened. It is difficult to determine when forgiveness is presently called for and when it needs to be done from a safe distance. This is when we pray the Spirit guide us and console us while we try to live a gospel of forgiveness as authentically as possible.

To forgive is to live grace. To forgive is to reveal a life infused with the love of God. To forgive is to enter the mystery of Jesus and allow Him to turn our hearts of stone into hearts of flesh. He asks this of us because He knows what it does; He's done it Himself. Forgiveness allows us to join the Father in re-creating His beloved creation. Forgiveness gives us a new-found freedom to face death and come out on the other side victorious and washed in the blood of the Lamb. Forgiveness rips open our hearts to receive the mercy of a Father who runs the dusty and winding road to hold us to Himself and shout His love for us. We forgive because we are forgiven. We love because we are loved.
